Music for Minors (currently has only 1 trained volunteer who does all 3
 Kindergarten and 1st grade classes. Creates music and teaches children about instruments as well as how to read music)

How programs are funded by Parents Club

- School Supply Kits a teacher recommended list of items needed, available to order through club at end of year.
- See's Candy Fundraiser occurs around holidays typically related to candy (ie. Easter/Valentines Day). Recommended more for parents, rather than sending children door to door. (it is a district policy to not send candy/food home with the child, but rather be sent home directly to parents)
- Olive Oil/Vinegar made by a past Chabot family, we receive at wholesale cost.
 Offered 2x/year multiple flavors of gourmet olive oil and/or vinegar. Fun for kids as there is a "themed" art contest to design labels for the glass bottles. Lots of "winners" as there is a design selected for each flavor.
- Restaurant Fundraisers % of sales from restaurants such as Rita's, Knudsen's Ice Creamery (pancake breakfast). There are a few a year and will be announced.
- Tigerthon essentially a giant walk-a-thon. Funds are raised based on laps walked. Awards given for most laps walked, child/class that raises most money.
- Oakland A's tickets approximately 8-10 games/year, Chabot receives a % of ticket sales. A direct link to ticket sales will go out through email.
- Shriek-a-rama Carnival held in the evening, Thursday before Halloween @
 5:00. Kids come in costume, carnival games, and a haunted garden.
- Online Auction a very low maintenance way for doing an auction, as it is a parent built website; will offer teacher treats (ie. going to ice cream with her), solicit donations from businesses.
- Membership dues

Incentive Programs

- Box Tops Found on many grocery-store items, children cut/glue box tops on sheets. A trophy goes to the class that collects the most each month. (Last year earned \$2525.30)
- eScrip most notably was Safeway, but they have since discontinued participation (last year earned ~ \$6000). Though it still exists, most vendors are out of our area.
- Amazon.com Associates Click through the Amazon link on the Parent Club website. School will receive a % of any purchases that are made on the Amazon site. (Last year earned \$747.47)

 Labels for Education - similar to Box Tops, except school receives merchandise rather than money - found on labels of Campbell's, Pepperidge Farm, V8(Splash/VFusion), Pace...

Treasurer Report & 2015-16 Budget Overview - Kim Scaboo

- Total liabilities and equity \$131,155.35
- Checking \$100,924.52; Money Market Savings \$30,230.83
- Chabot will no longer be doing the Holiday Gift shop or the Mixed bag fundraiser
- IA Science (K-3) upped the hours from 1 to 2x a month grades 4 and 5 are funded by the district.
- No longer pay for the accelerated reader program, as it is being funded by school.
- Teacher Reimbursements have been raised from \$11/child to \$20/child at a ratio (K-3) 26 children and 4-5 32 children.
- FAME Parents put on whole lessons in each classroom to teach art/music; benefits every child in school valuable program to put funds toward. Budget increased to \$100/classroom.
- Spring Musical makes enough \$\$ to fund itself; budget created by musical staff/ticket sales
- Tigerthon budget of 20K always exceeds budget
